Use this form if your child is a Samoan citizen aged 15 years or under and they want to apply for New Zealand citizenship by grant.

Both parents must give their consent before New Zealand citizenship can be granted to a child.

Before you apply

To be eligible for a grant of citizenship under the Citizenship (Western Samoa) Act 1982, your child must meet the following criteria:

- Your child is a Samoan citizen; and
- Your child lawfully entered New Zealand and has New Zealand residence.

‘Lawfully enter’ means that your child had a permit to enter New Zealand and they used their own passport.

‘New Zealand residence’ means your child has a current residence permit, permanent residence visa or residence visa issued by Immigration New Zealand (INZ), your child is an Australian citizen or permanent resident, or your child is a New Zealand citizen by descent.

What you need to complete this application

- Your child’s original birth certificate.
- Passports of both parents or legal guardians.
- Your child’s current passport(s) or most recent if it has expired.
- 2 identical colour passport-style photos of your child that are less than 6 months old. We recommend you have your photos taken by a business that offers a passport photo service. These businesses can ensure your photos meet our requirements. Do not staple, glue or paper-clip photos to this application as this damages the photos.
- A person who can act as a witness for your child. They must complete Section 7: Witness section.
- The application fee of \$235.10 per child aged 15 years or under.

We may ask you to send us other documents.

We do not accept photocopies.

If you do not have all the original documents you need, you can contact your local embassy or ask a relative in Samoa for help.

Make sure the information you provide is true and correct. All questions must be answered. If you need more space to answer a question, use another piece of paper. If it is later found that you have provided false or misleading information, your child may be denied or lose New Zealand citizenship once it is granted. You may also face criminal charges, or both.

Withdrawals and refunds

If your child does not meet the requirements for citizenship, you can withdraw the application and get a partial refund of the application fee. Part of the fee is kept to cover the costs of the initial processing of your child's application.

Privacy statement

Collection, authorisation, and use of information in support of this application

In order to process your child's citizenship application, we will need to collect some personal information from you. The decision to give us this information is your choice. If you do not give us all the information we need, we may decline your child's application.

We need this information to:

- verify you and your child's identity, and
- assist the Minister of Internal Affairs to decide whether your child qualifies for a grant of New Zealand citizenship.

We collect and hold information from this form at the Department of Internal Affairs, PO Box 10680, Wellington. Under the Privacy Act 2020 you can request access to and correction of the personal information we hold about you or your child.

The information collected in your application may be used in statistical analysis and reporting for service improvement and business management purposes. Personal information will only be used where necessary for those purposes.

Data is stored, accessed and retained in accordance with our Privacy Policy, Information Management Policy, and the DIA Code of Conduct which incorporates our ICT and security policies, and in compliance with the Privacy Act 2020 and the Public Records Act 2005.

Information sharing

The Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) relies on the Identity Services Approved Information Sharing Agreement (IS AISA) to access information relating to your and your child's birth, death, marriage, name change, civil union and passport when verifying your identity.

DIA relies on the Customer Nominated Services Approved Information Sharing Agreement (CNS AISA) to share information with Immigration New Zealand (INZ) to verify your and your child's identity and confirm eligibility requirements are met for a grant of New Zealand citizenship.

DIA may share your child's citizenship information once they have been granted citizenship with other government agencies. Full details of DIA's information-sharing practices are available on our website: dia.govt.nz/Legal-Privacy-Index

Disclaimer

Checklist

Before you bring or send us your child's application, make sure you have everything you need.

You must provide original documents – not copies.

All original documents will be returned to you.

If you do not provide all the original documents that you need to, your child's application will be delayed.

If you are unable to give us these documents, you will need to explain why in a letter with your application.

What you need to send:

- your child's full birth certificate, or equivalent (must include details of both parents)
- all your child's current passports, travel documents or equivalent (or most recent if it has expired)
- both parents' passports
- 2 passport-style photos of your child that the witness has signed, dated and written your child's name on the back of 1 of the photos
- filled out payment details in question 31 on page 19 (application fee \$235.10 per child)

You might also need to send these documents:

- if your child does not have a Samoan passport, proof of your child's Samoan citizenship
- if your child's name has changed, your child's name change or adoption documents
- anything else we should know that might affect your child's application.

If your documents are not in English, you may also need:

- authorised translations of your documents (if your documents are not in English and you already have an authorised translation, provide the translation with the original document).

If you do not have an authorised translation, provide your original documents and we will arrange for them to be translated. There is no charge for this unless you require a copy of the translation for your own purposes. If you require a copy of the translation, download a T100 Request for translation form from [govt.nz/request for translation](http://govt.nz/request-for-translation) and include this with your application.

If you have already registered your child as a New Zealand citizen by descent and want to change their status to citizen by grant you need to bring in or send:

- your child's original New Zealand citizenship by descent certificate.

Section 6: Parents' consent and declarations

We require a court order that specifically refers to sole legal guardianship. A custody order on its own does not give sole legal guardianship over a child. If you are unsure, contact us.

Warning: It is an offence under the Citizenship Act 1977 and/or Citizenship (Western Samoa) Act 1982 to knowingly or recklessly give false information or conceal any facts for the purpose of gaining New Zealand citizenship for oneself or on behalf of someone else. If you do so, your child may be denied citizenship or lose citizenship once it is granted. You may also face criminal charges.

I recognise that this information may be provided by agencies including, but not limited to: New Zealand Police, Inland Revenue, New Zealand Customs Service, Immigration New Zealand, Ministry of Social Development, Passport Office, Births, Deaths and Marriages Registry, Ministry of Justice.
